GUIDELINES & GENERAL ADMISSION RULES FOR BACHELOR'S DEGREE

- 1. Admission to various classes will be made on the recommendation of the admission committee constituted for the purpose.
- 2. An applicant with a gap of one year or more in the academic career must fill the column specifically mentioned in the application form for the purpose. No separate gap affidavit/documentary evidence required.
- The application form must be complete in all respects along with the following documents:

 Attested copy of detailed marks sheet of the previous examination passed. In case of unavailability of this certificate, the applicant must attach a certificate issued by the Head of the institution last attended.
 Attested copy of Matriculation/date of birth certificate.

- c. Character certificate (in original) from the institution last attended.
- d. Three passport size photographs of the applicant.
- 4. Applicants must produce original certificates at the time of admission.
- 5. Applicants coming from Boards/Universities other than the H.P. Board of School Education/S.P.U. must provide a migration certificate in original.
- 6. Handicapped applicants seeking fee concession must furnish their status certificate from the Medical Board.
- 7. If a candidate intends to take up Mathematics in B.A. 1, he/she should have studied Mathematics at 10+2 level and secured either 45% marks in the subject or aggregate.
- 9. Admission is also open to an applicant who has any degree from foreign University /Board /College which is recognized by the Association of Indian Universities/ or the S.P.U.
- 10. No suchstudent will be admitted to B.A./B.Com/B.Sc.-1st year who has been placed under compartment in 10+2 Exam.

Note : Admissions confirmation to First year of B.A./B. Com./B.Sc. will be notified as per the final directions from the Govt./S.P.U.

ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS

- A pass in the Senior Secondary (10+2) Examination (Academic Stream) conducted by the H.P Board of School Education (or in case of *Shashtri*, pass in *Prak Shashtri*from Sanskrit Colleges affiliated to the HPU) or an examination accepted as equivalent thereto by various bodies/Executive Council of S.P.U. An applicant who has passed the qualifying examination with science stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Sc. program.
- 2. An applicant who has passed the qualifying examination with commerce stream shall be given preference in admission to B. Com. program.
- 3. An applicant must not be more than 23 years of age (25 years for girl students only) on 01-07-2025. The upper age limits were raised to 26 years for S.C. and S.T. applicants. However, in case of overage applicants, the Vice-Chancellor, S.P.U. may allow a relaxation up to six months.
- 4. An applicant having passed the 10+2 examination with English as one of the compulsory subjects from any Indian University/Board recognized by law can seek admission.
- 5. Admission of a student is liable to be canceled in case he/she furnishes incomplete/ wrong/ false information or in case of concealment of facts. Disciplinary action will also be taken against such a candidate.
- 6. Initially all admissions shall be provisional and subject to the final approval by S.P.U.
- 7. Rules of admission are subject to change as per the Himachal Pradesh University notifications issued from time to time.
- 8. The Principal reserves the right to disallow or cancel any admission.
- 9. Admission will be as per 200 point roster prescribed by the University.
- 10. Applicants must appear for an interview personally before the admission committee.

CBCS – RUSA

Choosing Program Study Courses:

1. At the time of admission each student will identify a Discipline Specific Core Course (DSC-I) in which he/she will concentrate and a Discipline Specific Core Course (DSC-II) in whichhe / she will choose to study.

2. DSC-I once identified would not be changed unless the student quits a programme and joins a new program.

3. DSC-II on the other hand, would be the subject that would be chosen by the student out of a number of subject combinations suggested & approved by UG BOS & faculty of student of the concerned subject.

Duration of the Course (Time Frame):

The UG (TDC) program for a regular student shall be for a minimum period of three years and a maximum of five years from the date of admission of the candidate.

Requirement for the Degree:

1. A regular candidate will have to undergo the prescribed courses of study in the college. For the degree (B.A. / B. Sc. / B. Com.), the student will have to cumulate a minimum of 132 successful credit hours of course work over a minimum of three and a maximum of five years from the date of admission.

2. Not more than three attempts will be allowed to pass a course.

Note : -For the students of first and second year, if a candidate has more than three reappear subjects in the annual exams, he or she will not be promoted to the next higher class during that academic year. Instead, the candidate must clear the reappear papers in the subsequent examination(Supplementary/regular) as a reappear candidate, Promotion to the next academic session, starting from the June/July of the following year, will only be granted once the number of reappear subjects in reduced to three or fewer.

Further clarifications regarding this promotion policy are as follows: -

- 1. Candidates with reappear in more than three subjects will be considered as reappear candidate in the supplementary/regular examination.
- 2. Such Candidate will not be allowed to continue in the next higher class during the complete session upto April Next year.
- 3. Reappear candidates must appear in the subsequent supplementary or annual examination to clear the failed subjects.
- 4. If the reappearing candidate qualifies for promotion by passing the supplementary exams, their admission to the next higher class will only be granted during the regular admission period of subsequent year i.e. June/July next year. They will not be allowed to join the next higher class immediately after passing the supplementary exams in the middle of the session.
- 5. The candidate must complete his/her degree in the stipulated time limit of the respective course as per the regulations.
- 6. For all the students who have failed in more than three subjects, their provisional admission will be canceled immediately after the declaration of the results, and they will be reverted to the previous class.
- 7. Candidate up to the three reappear will be allowed to continue in the next higher class and He /She has to pass these papers within the time limit of course i.e. within 5 years

The CBCS System (Earning Credits)

All the above-mentioned Program (named as the DSC-I subject (core/ main) chosen by the student) are being run on Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). The program is considered completed when the student cumulates the requisite number of successful credits (passed), i.e. at least 132 credits for an undergraduate degree.

* The eligible students having CGPA more than or equal to 7.5 at the end of 06^{th} semester shall be offered the option of taking up research in the 8^{th} semester of PG Program in the form of research project/dissertation.

RULES OF REFUSAL OF ADMISSION

- 1. Applicants who have passed intermediate from Hindi Sahitya Sammelan, Allahabad or Prabhakar are not eligible for admission in Regular UG courses mentioned above.
- 2. Candidates placed under compartment from colleges affiliated to universities other than H.P. will not be admitted in 2nd and 3rd year.
- 3. Any candidate who has not appeared in/passed English as a subject at 10+2 level shall not be eligible for admission in 1st year.
- 4. In spite of the eligibility for admission, Principal can refuse admission if the conduct of the student has not been up to the mark during previous years.
- 5. Principal reserves the right to disallow or cancel any admission.

MIGRATION

The admission of the students migrating during the same course/session from one affiliated college or institution (including ICDEOL) to another affiliated college or institution shall be governed by the regulations framed by the Executive Council of the University from time to time.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE AND INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Fill up the application form in your own handwriting and get it signed by your parent/local guardian.
- 2. Bring three passport size photographs (not more than three months old) and photostat copies of Matric, 10+2, Character Certificate (original), Bonafide certificate and SC/ST/ physically handicapped certificate as the case may be.
- 3. Bring migration certificate from School Board other than H.P.B.O.S.E.
- 4. Don't furnish any false information in the application form. It is a serious offense and invites legal penalty.
- 5. Bring original documents at the time of admission.
- 6. It is mandatory for 1st year students to bring at least one of their parents or local guardians at the time of admission.
- 7. For fees and funds consult the fee chart.
- 8. Appear for counseling personally before the Admission Committee.
- 9. Appear before the Principal in his office for final admission.
- 10. Pay the dues at the fee counter and make sure that you get your fee receipt.
- 11. Don't give money to other students to pay your dues.
- 12. Show the fee receipt to the librarian in the library and get the Identity Card.

13. Income Certificate to be produced if the annual income is less than Rupees 2.5 Lakh.

Note: Recurring Mess, Electricity and water charges are to be recovered on actual basis from students. At the time of admission in the Hostel, the student will pay monthly charges for six months in addition to the one-time charges and securities.

LIBRARYAND RULES

- 1. The college library has a collection of approx. 5000 books on different subjects on the shelves. It subscribes to 05 daily newspapers and 16 periodicals regularly. There is a well-maintained reading room.
- 2. Immediately after admission, a student is required to collect the **Library-cum-Identity card** on production of his/her fee receipt. He/she has to get it signed in person by his/her tutor, librarian and then finally by Principal. The card should be kept carefully by the student.
- 3. Ordinarily, maximum two books are issued at a time for 15 days, but the librarian can recall the same at any time.
- 4. If the books are not returned by the due date, a fine of Rs. 1/- per book per day will be charged for the overdue period.
- 5. Reference books and periodicals/ journals/ magazines/Newspapers are not issued; however, the students can consult the same in the library.
- 6. The student shall be responsible for the book as soon as it is issued. Books torn/ damaged/defaced in any manner will not be accepted. In case of loss of a book, the student will have to replace the book or pay a fine in addition to the present price of the book with special permission of the Principal.
- 7. Books are issued only on production of the Library-cum-Identity card.
- 8. In case of loss of the Library-cum-Identity card, the duplicate can be had by making an application to Principal, paying Rs. 20/- and on production of the copy of the FIR lodged with the police.
- 9. If a student fails to claim refund of library security within one year of leaving the college, it shall automatically stand lapsed.
- 10. In case of any damage to books issued to a student, he/she will have to entail a fine of Rs. 50.00 in addition to the actual cost of the book.

LEAVE RULES FOR STUDENTS

- 1. A student can proceed on leave with prior permission from the **Tutor of concerned department**, but the application should also be signed by the parents/guardian of the student and duly recommended by the tutor.
- 2. A tutor can recommend leave for up to **6 days**. For a longer duration, a student should get a leave application signed by the **Senior tutor**.
- 3. Leave during House Examination will be sanctioned by Principal on the recommendation of the senior tutor in special cases only.
- 4. Leave on account of illness must be accompanied by a Medical Certificate.
- 5. If a student remains absent continuously for **more than 10 days** without authorized leave, his/her name will be **struck off** from the college roll. Such students will have to seek re-admission by making an application giving the reason to Principal with recommendation of the teacher concerned and on payment of the prescribed fee (see fee detail). A student can only be readmitted twice. He shall cease to be a student after that. Readmission is required to be sought within ten days of the date on which the notice of struck-off is put on the Notice Board, failing which it is to be assumed that the student is not interested in continuing his/her studies.

EVALUATION SCHEME

The students will be evaluated through formal as well as informal assessment processes as per the guidelines from Sardar Patel University, Mandi.

HOUSE EXAMINATIONS AND LECTURE ATTENDANCE

- 1. To be eligible for appearing in HPU Term End examination, every student must attend at least 75% lectures both in theory and practical separately to be counted from the date on which regular teaching work is commenced. Principal can give credit for actual number of days/ lectures in every course including practical in respect of students who have to miss classes on account of their participation in Ranger & Rovers /NCC/N.S.S./Sports/Cultural or other academic activities.
- 2. Every student has to appear in the house exam secure pass marks in each subject and in the aggregate to be eligible to appear in SPU Final Examination.
- 3. A student who fails to show satisfactory results in Minor Tests shall forfeit claim to concession /financial assistance.
- 4. Any student who fails to fulfill the condition of minimum attendance (75%) and pass marks in CCA shall not be allowed to fill the SPU examination form/ appear in the Term End SPU examination as per the SPU regulations.

RULES FOR AWARD OF PRIZES IN ANNUAL FUNCTION

- 1. Prizes are given to the students who secure positions in the University/Mid Term/House Exam., Sports and Extra Co-curricular activities and represent the college in various inter college competitions.
- 2. Prizes will also be distributed to the students taking parts in various activities in the college.
- 3. Best reader and Best book user in the College library will also be awarded.

ACADEMICS

- 1. First, second and third prize to the students standing I, II and III respectively in the College in SPU Examination.
- 2. First and second prize to the students of undergraduate classes standing I and II in the subjects respectively in the College in SPU Examination.
- 3. Students not securing 50% marks in the aggregate or in the subject concerned and not passing examination in all subjects of study shall not be considered for the prizes.
- 4. "College Roll of Honour" will be awarded to a student securing a position in HPU merit list.

SPORTS/CULTURAL/NSS

- 1. First, second and third prize to the students securing I, II and III position respectively in National/Inter zonal/Inter-University/HP University/HP State sports/Cultural events.
- 2. First and second prize to the students securing I and II position respectively in the College sports / cultural events.
- 3. Prizes to NSS students for selection as Best Volunteer and Group Leader.
- 4. "College Colour" to the students for their outstanding performance in National / State / HPU sports or cultural or NCC or NSS events.

CO-CURRICULARACTIVITIES

- 1. N.C.C.: The NCC has been made functional since 2017. A total strength of 100 cadets (40 girls and 60 boys) has been sanctioned.
- 2. N.S.S.: The College has been allotted two units (100 volunteers each) of NSS by University. The new students shall be enrolled as NSS volunteers to take up regular as well as special camp activities in and around the College under NSS Program Officers as envisaged under the spirit of the scheme in the beginning of the session.
- 3. ROVERS AND RANGERS: The Bharat Scouts and Guides is a voluntary organization. Young adults are enrolled as Rovers and Rangers in the college. They are given training of leadership for the service of their motherland and the mankind at large. A strength of total 48 (24 ROVERS and 24 RANGERS) is sanctioned for the college.

EXTRA CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES, VARIOUS CLUBS AND SOCIETIES

The various curricular activities in the class rooms help in imparting bookish knowledge to the students as per the demands of the examination system, but unless certain other activities are undertaken, a student never acquires completeness. It is here that the role of co-curricular activities such as Energy Club, Eco club, Red Ribbon Club and Youth Red Cross comes in. Such activities along with class room involvement help to integrate the three very vital aspects of an individual viz. body, mind and soul. With the above objectives in mind, various clubs and societies have been constituted under the guidance of the able teachers. Students are advised to join at least one of the clubs and respective subject societies to become ennobled graduates on completion of their courses in this College.

STUDENTS' SUPPORT AND PROGRESSION

N-LIST Subscription

The Project entitled "National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content (N-LIST)", being jointly executed by the e-ShodhSindhu Consortium, INFLIBNET Centre and the INDEST-AICTE Consortium, IIT Delhi provides for i) cross-subscription to e-resources subscribed by the two Consortia, i.e. subscription to INDEST-AICTE resources for universities and e-ShodhSindhu resources for technical institutions; and ii) access to selected e-resources to colleges. The N-LIST project provides access to e-resources to students, researchers and faculty from colleges and other beneficiary institutions through server(s) installed at the INFLIBNET Centre. The authorized users from colleges can now access e-resources and download articles required by them directly from the publisher's website once they are duly authenticated as authorized users through servers deployed at the INFLIBNET Centre. The students can register themselves and get the benefits.

COLLEGE - MAGAZINE

The College publishes its magazine "**DEVDHARA Kamrunag**" every year. It has various sections covering writeups in English, Hindi, Sanskrit, Commerce, Pahari and Planning Forum showing the creative skills of the young student-writers. The College magazine provides an opportunity to the budding student -writers to express their creative, innovative and analytical views with regard to various issues. Those students who want to contribute their vibrant write-ups should contact/consult staff/ student editors of various sections in this regard during the session.

CAREER GUIDANCE, COUNSELING AND PLACEMENT CELL

The College has established a Career Guidance, Counseling and Placement Cell for the benefit of the students as per the instructions of the Government. The members of the Cell are always available to guide the students in selecting and pursuing the most suitable careers considering their abilities. The Committee also aims at helping the students in developing their personalities and sharpens their communication skills.

OLD STUDENTS' ASSOCIATION (OSA)

The college has framed Old Students' Association (OSA). All the students passing from the college will become members of this association. The members are encouraged to donate voluntarily for the betterment of the college and students.

IT LABS AND SMART CLASSROOM

In the modern age of digitalization two IT labs (one in science block & other in arts block) and one Smart Classroom has also been set up in the college.

HOSTEL FACILITY FOR GIRLS

The college has got well-furnished hostel for girls with a capacity to accommodate 63 students. Hostel has been made functional from the session 2010-11. It has all the facilities such as spacious hostel rooms with required furniture, dining room, common room with T.V. and Dish facility, clean water with aqua guard and other amenities to make the living experience very much conducive to studies. Newspaper and Magazines are also available for the hostlers. The following rules have been framed in relation to admission and the conduct of hostel residents:

- 1. A student can apply for hostel accommodation, after she is admitted in the college.
- 2. Admission forms for hostel accommodation are available in the college office.
- 3. Students belonging to SC/ST/OBC category will be given preference in allotment.
- 4. The recommendation of warden is necessary for admission to the hostel.
- 5. The residents of the hostel are not permitted to change the room allotted to them without prior permission of the warden.
- 6. Fresh admission to the hostel will have to be sought in every academic year.
- 7. Every boarder shall have to abide by timeschedule as laid down from time to time.
- 8. No guest can stay in the hostel.
- 9. The general discipline requirement of the college shall be applicable to boarder as well.
- 10. Any other rules and regulations as may be deemed necessary by the principal according to the circumstances are to be observed by the resident scholars.
- 11. Hostel students will not indulge in any act that may come under the definition of ragging; they will not participate in or abet ragging in any form. Action under the Ragging Act shall be initiated against anyone found guilty of involvement in acts included in the definition of ragging.
- 12. Smoking, use of tobacco products and consumption of alcohol are strictly prohibited. Any violation will entail a fine of Rs. 200/- and suspension/ expulsion from the hostel.

SCHOLARSHIPS

The students shall have to apply online for these scholarships by submitting an application online and the subsequent verification will be done by the College. The concerned student is required to have an Account in any of the Nationalized Banks and Aadhaar Enrolment. Students should ensure that the Name and other details must be same in respective Aadhaar Card, Bank Account and Academic Certificates.

CODE OF CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

- 1. Every student should carry **his/her Identity Card**, which will be issued to the students after the admission. It should be worn by the students to have clear visibility.
- 2. Every student has to refrain himself/herself from any act of Ragging as any act of ragging in the campus or in or around the hostel will be severely dealt with. Ragging implies harassment, physical or mental torture to another student by a student or group of students. Each student has tofill on-line form available on the Anti Ragging portal of UGC after admission to the college.
- 3. Following acts will be construed as acts of misconduct and indiscipline and punished with either fine or suspension/expulsion or both:-
 - Writing obscenities/dirty words on black boards, walls or furniture or banging doors etc.
 - Loitering aimlessly in the verandas, making noise or trying to disturb classes.
 - Smoking, taking drugs/alcohol and chewing tobacco, spitting etc. in the college campus is strictly prohibited.
 - Outsiders/miscreants/anti- social elements are not allowed in the college campus.
 - Pasting posters/Writing slogans on the walls of college campus or on the Notice Board without prior permission of the Principal.
 - Misbehaving with teachers/other staff members.
 - Holding of any meeting/Rally in the campus without prior permission.
 - Using mobile phones in the class rooms.
 - Indulging in any rash/unbecoming behavior
 - Making vehicle noise in college campus/silence zone.
- 4. Parents/Guardians are requested to remain in touch with the Principal and the teachers regarding the progress of their wards.

PARENT TEACHER ASSOCIATION (PTA)

It has contributed a lot to the development of the College. Its main objectives include revival of the relationship between the parents and teachers, to create healthy educational environment, to arrange discussions with the elder persons of the society from time to time and incorporate their suggestions for the improvement of the educational standards , to suggest ways so that students' education is promoted, to make a collective effort to improve the conduct of the students and also to restrict the entry of anti-social elements in the campus, to inform the parents/guardians about the performance of their wards from time to time and to make arrangement for the parents to meet the concerned staff once in a quarter, to arrange teachers etc. when there is a shortage of staff in the institution as a temporary measure, and to make the parents aware of various schemes of the Govt. in the area of education.

On admission of a student, his/ her parent (father or mother) or guardian (only blood relation) automatically becomes member of the PTA.

NEW INITIATIVES

It has been decided that the following initiatives will be part of the teaching-learning process:

- 1. Every student shall have to submit at least one written assignment to the teacher concerned as per his/her directions in respect of each subject every month.
- 2. There shall be a class test of 45 minutes duration in each subject every month. Absentees will have to pay fine.
- 3. Every subject society shall organize at least one function/seminar/paper presentation/workshop/panel discussion/ group discussion, quiz etc. once in every two months between 2.00 to 4.00 PM. The students shall have to participate in or attend the same in his/her overall interest. Absentees shall have to pay fine levied by the college authorities.
- 4. The students shall be encouraged to participate in classes so that their communication skills and abilities are enhanced.
- 5. The students shall be encouraged to participate in all the college functions as and when held.
- 6. The attendance of students will be compulsory. Absentees will have to pay the fine.

Prevention of Sexual harassment of Women at work place (Prevention, Prohibition and redressal) Act-2013.
